**PREA ANNUAL REPORT  
2015**


Daviess County Detention Center (DCDC) implemented the PREA standards in 2013. While working through a strategic plan, DCDC was able to identify problem areas or areas lacking compliance and addressed each one. Some actions that were taken include adding more cameras and including more training regarding staff manipulation by inmates to the annual in-service training hours.

One way DCDC has made progress is by taking all allegations seriously and investigated each one thoroughly. One DCDC staff investigator has been certified to train other department staff to become PREA investigators. The current number of PREA investigators is five.



When reviewing the sexual harassment data, consideration may be given to the fact that inmates have been found to utilize PREA allegations as a means to retaliate against staff and fellow inmates for non-PREA related reasons. This is reflected in the fact that when these allegations were investigated, a majority of the cases were found to be unsubstantiated or unfounded.
